Learning about agriculture is more than child's play. The primary focus of Kane County Farm Bureau's agricultural literacy programs is on teachers. KCFB coordinates two annual graduate-credit courses (Summer Ag

Institute I & II) that highlight the agricultural research and development, production, marketing and processing that make food and fiber production our nation's largest industry.

Teachers attending Summer Ag Institutes consistently rank them among the best educational experiences of their careers. Dozens of local farms, agribusinesses, research institutions and agencies cooperate to make this educational program possible, but additional assistance is always welcome.

Ag Days

Since 1985, the Farm Bureau Women's Committee has issued "Ag Days" invites to all Kane County 4th grade classrooms. Each March over 2,000 students respond and receive up to 20 interactive presentations about agriculture and farm life from area farmers, commodity groups, and agribusiness leaders.
