Census of Agriculture deadline-Ag Census responses due in Feb.

Farmers across the U.S. may have noticed a small envelope in their mail recently. It's time for the 2022 Census of Agriculture! Farmers who are signed up to receive the survey will get a let-

ter in the mail that contains a link to a web address and a code specific to each participant. You are encouraged to find time in the coming THE AG CENSUS COUNTS weeks to sit down and

fill it out. You may remember that Illinois farmers had the highest response rate in the country in the 2017 Census of Agriculture.

The Census of Agriculture is conducted every 5 years. USDA is asking for your help to again provide the best information about your operation in order to make fact-based decisions with confidence. For this census, you will see questions about input costs and farm expenditures. As we've seen those costs go up, it



is important to get an adequate picture to best convey the challenges in farm country, as well as possible solutions. As farmers look at other challenges, such as labor, this data will provide a great foundation for USDA, farm organizations and lawmakers to make solution based pub-

lic policy for agriculture.

This once-every-five-years survey aims to capture U.S. farms and the people who operate them. If \$1,000 or more of agricultural products are raised

or sold, whether from a rural or urban plot of land, you can be counted. The Census of Agriculture captures information about a

variety of topics, VEO including land use and ownership, operator characteristics, production practices, farm income, and, important this year, farm inputs and expenditures.

In the 2017 Census of Agriculture, Illinois farmers had the highest participation rate of all U.S. states.

40 new conservation planner positions

As producer demand for conservation grows, resources and staff for our federal and local conservation workforces are often stretched thin. Over the past decade, USDA and their conservation partners have struggled to keep staffing levels on pace with attrition.

To address the need, IDOA in partnership with its Partners for Conservation program is taking action to bolster the conservation workforce pipeline. With funding from the state legislature, IDOA is positioned to work with NRCS and conservation districts as employers of 40 new Conservation Planner positions in Illinois, including in the counties of Kane, McHenry and Boone. This will allow the Natural Resource Conservation

and expand Nutrient Loss Reduction Strategy efforts in Illinois, increase Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) technical assistance to Illinois CRP participants, and to increase general conservation planning assistance to Illinois landowners, users, and producers.

Conservation planners will be recruited and supervised by IDOA and hired by a subcontract hiring agent (the local SWCD). The staff will be located in NRCS or IDOA offices across the state Staff locations will be evaluated based on NRCS and IDOA conservation planning workload needs, space availability, and the local office's capacity to engage the additional staff.

The conservation planners will increase CRP technical assistance for planning, implementation, and maintenance. (continued on page 3)

Private well testing program in February The Kane County Farm Kane/DuPage Soil and Water

Bureau and Kane/DuPage Soil and Water Conservation District are cooperating again to offer a water testing program in February 2023. A high quality water supply is vital for families, and this program helps provide peace of mind and identifies potential problem areas for homeowners of Kane County.

The program works simply as follows:

Step 1. Monday, February 20 – Friday, March 3, 2023

Pick up water test kits from the Kane County Farm Bureau, 8:30am-4:30pm or from Conservation District, 8am -4:30pm, M-F. Payment is due for each test kit upon pick-up.

Step 2. Sunday, March 5, 2023 Collect the water sample.

Step 3. Monday, March 6, 2023 Return water sample to Farm

Bureau or Kane/DuPage Soil & Water Conservation District.

Unlike previous programs for well water resting, our winter 2023 tests offer only one option as described below:

A. Basic Package (Nitrate Package) – \$45.00

Tests for nitrate, nitrite, ammonia, chloride, sulfate, soluble phosphorus, silica and specific conductivity.

More detailed sampling instructions will be included in each kit and additional information on how each test can help you is provided at the Farm Bureau or Kane/DuPage Soil and Water Conservation's District offices. Testing will be performed by Heidelburg College Water Quality Laboratory in Tiffin, Ohio, a certified lab that has been nationally recognized for its work in testing rivers and lakes, and results are mailed directly to your home. We are able to provide these deeply discounted

testing fees because we are providing the laboratory a bulk number to be tested.

Kane County Farm Bureau will host a two-hour trucking seminar focusing on transportation laws and regulations as they pertain to the agricultural industry.

A session for farmers in Northeast Illinois will be held on March 14 at 5:30 pm at the More Brewery, 13980 Automall Drive in Huntley.

"There are some trucking laws that have been reshaped in recent years, such as the Entry Level Driver Training Requirement that went into effect in 2022," said Rodney Knittel. IFB assistant director of transportation and infrastructure. "These presentations are designed to take a closer look at

these latest rules and provide an opportunity for farmers to ask those ag-related trucking questions that they can't seem to find clear answers for."

This Rules for the Road Seminar will cover recent changes and some of the more established but still misunderstood rules, such as the USDOT Number, UCR registrations and driver's license classifications, to name a few. 



FB Foundation to offer community service grants to FFA Chapters

To recognize and encourage the continued contributions of students from Kane County FFA Chapters in the success of Kane County Farm Bureau programs, the KCFB Foundation will offer 2023 incentives in the form of "FFA Chapter Grants".

For many years FFA Chapters assisted the Farm Bureau annually with its largest educational undertaking, Ag Days, where fourth graders gather at the Mooseheart grounds in March for farm-themed lessons. In recent years, individual FFA members have also been crucial to the success of the Farm Bureau's Touch-A-Tractor and county fair promotions.

"We're happy to be able to offer these funds to local FFA Chapters," said Foundation President Joe White. "FFA does a lot for the future of agriculture and the success of young people in all walks of life." He adds, "Their participation in Farm Bureau programs helps FFA members build teamwork, leadership development, and presentation skills while representing their Chapter to the public - and we receive capable volunteers and exposure to the next generation of agricultural leaders."

The Farm Bureau Foundation will renew its pledge to FFA Chapters in return for assistance with community service, education and promotional programs in 2023 which will promote leadership development skills in FFA members. They are Touch-A-Tractor in April, the Kane County Fair in July and the Young Farmers Acquaintance program. Participation in two or more of these programs will earn FFA Chapters a minimum \$250 Chapter Grant.

Participation in all three will earn the Chapter \$400. Up to an additional \$100 will be offered to FFA Chapters that complete and report a community service activity, bringing the potential award up to \$500 per FFA Chapter.

FFA Advisors report that the unrestricted grants give students the chance to do bigger projects in the community. "Service-oriented activities, such as working with food pantries or sending care packages to troops overseas, teach the students good citizenship skills," said Ryan Robinson, Central FFA Advisor. "If we qualify, we would use the grant funds to complete projects with higher costs, such as landscaping projects in the community."

In 2020, the KCFB Foundation provided \$20,000 to the Hinckley-Big Rock FFA alumni to help the group construct and equip an agriculture education building on the school campus, in addition to the district's FFA Chapter Grant. The Foundation is seeking similar local ag-education volunteer projects in need of financial assistance

The Kane County Farm Bureau is a not-for-profit membership organization, representing the interests of local agriculturalists. The Bureau's Foundation provides funding to support agricultural, educational, and leadership development for the benefit of agriculture and local farm families. In Kane County, FFA has three chapters at local high schools in Burlington, Hinckley Big Rock, and Kaneland. In 2022 each Chapter earned the full \$500 grant.

My mental pauses on the farm often arrive at sunrise, sunset and the moments when family is most accentuated on the farm. Harvest brings those experiences together: My dad and brother run the combines. My son and I operate the tractors with grain auger carts. A long-time employee who watched me grow up on the farm hauls grain, as does his son, a cousin and a local truck driver, all who now watch my kids grow up on the farm.

My daughter takes turns with our cousin's wife to weigh grain trucks at our storage facility. My nephew replaces me in the tractor after football practice, and my mom manages the bills and delivers meals around sunset to keep our farm running and bodies fueled. Family

defines the farm. Family members make the decisions that care for the

land and animals. They carry out the work, uphold the commitment to community and plan for the next generation.

We are the 96%. Families like ours operate 96% of farms in the state, and Illinois agriculture groups have designated 2023 the "Year of the Farmer" to proclaim this statistic. The celebration intends to debunk a disconcerting myth: A consumer survey indicates that people believe corporations run most farms and that families only run 47% of the Illinois farms they see.

To the contrary, I see Matt grow grain and beef with his brother and nephews, Kevin farm with his brother and their wives, and Alan with his dad and sister. Lori farms with her husband, Ron with his daughter and brothers, and Jay with his mom, wife, brother and teenage kids.

2023 Certified Livestock Manager workshops, online training

The Livestock Management Facilities Act, requires livestock facilities in Illinois that house 300 or more animal units to have at least one person certified in the environmental protection aspects of manure management. The certificate is administered by the Illinois Department of Agriculture and is valid for three years.

Requirements to become a certified livestock manager vary by the capacity of the facility:

- 300-999 animal units: attend a workshop or complete online training
- \geq 1,000 animal units: attend a workshop and pass IDoA's paper-based test offered immediately following each workshop or complete online training and pass the online test.

For 2023 the test has been updated and a Spanish version of the test is now available. Ahora ya est disponible una versión en español del examen para CLMT!

workshops CLMT are offered every winter, usually between January and March. If you cannot make a workshop or need certification in the off-season, online training modules that will meet CLM certification requirements are available.

University of Illinois Extension local CLMT workshops dates and locations are listed below. On the day of the workshop, registration will open at 8:30 a.m. with training program starting promptly at 9:00 a.m. A range of topics related to the operation, management, and utilization of livestock waste and waste facilities will be covered. Additionally, the latest regulations, best management practices, and research for manure-related issues will be discussed. Registration is requested and now open.
